1989 Minister of Internal Affairs in Greece

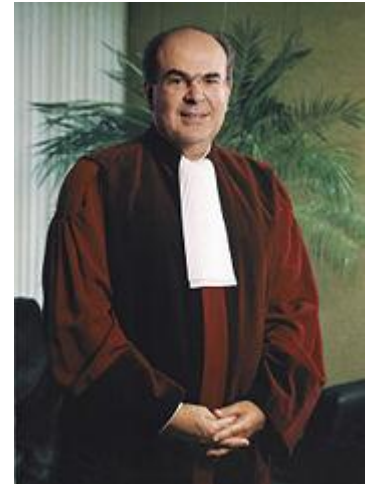
1992 President of the Greek association for European Law

Role in the EU:

- The ECJ is charged with interpreting the EU Treaties
- The EU Court of Justice (ECJ) is made up of 27 judges (one from each member state, nominated by their home governments for a six-year term).
- The judges choose a President to serve for a renewable term of three years.
- Cases are usually heard before chambers of three to five judges.
